
# SOUTH TAMAR ART TRAIL





## Mine captain's mystery unfolds in gripping trilogy...

Calstock based writer Petrus Ursem recently published 'Black as Ink', the final instalment of a thriller which started with 'The Fortune of the Seventh Stone' and 'The Truth Teller'.



The story is largely set in the Tamar Valley — local readers

will recognise (ficitionalised) landmarks. Petrus Ursem has cleverly forged links between the mining history and the drive of a teenage boy to find his place in a world at risk of mind-games and betrayal.

The rich layering of mystery and the challenge to find truths make these books a real treat.

### SAFETY PRECAUTIONS with regard to COVID19
